

Tri-Cities 911 Driving School
Approved DOL Testing

1. The fee for the knowledge test is \$30.00. *
 2. The fee for a private knowledge test is \$50.00. *
 3. The fee for the skill test is \$50.00 for the general public and \$35.00 for TC 911 DS students. *
 4. Re-take of the knowledge test is \$25.00. *
 5. Re-take of the skills test is \$50.00 for the general public and \$35.00 for TC 911 DS students. *
- * The test fee covers one attempt taken within one year of the receipt and are separate from the fee charged for a Driver Training Course and DOL's application and licensing fees.
6. Payment is due at the time of scheduling.
 7. All testing fees are non-refundable.
 8. A 24-hour notice is required to reschedule a testing appointment. Testing fees will be forfeited by the applicant for late cancelations, no-shows, or showing up unprepared.
 9. Applicants must provide photo ID for proof of identification at the time of testing. Acceptable photo ID includes, but is not limited to, pictured state ID or permit, passport, out of state license, school ID, library card or school yearbook.
 10. Knowledge tests are taken online using the school's devices. Applicants must have an LX account to gain access to the test.
 11. While taking the knowledge test – no talking, no opening other browsers or applications, and no headphones except to have the questions read aloud.
 12. The knowledge test consists of 40 multiple-choice questions about traffic safety laws. Applicants must answer at least 32 questions correctly to pass.
 13. A passing score on the knowledge test is required before being able to take the skill test.
 14. All skill tests will be performed in a driving school vehicle. With the exception of applicants who are required to have an ignition interlock. (please see #21 below).
 15. Applicants must demonstrate arm signals prior to beginning the skills test.
 16. The skill test will determine the applicant's ability to drive legally and safely. Applicants must pass the skill test with a score of at least 80%.
 17. Test scores will be entered into the DOL database within 24 hours. Applicants must visit a DOL office to apply for their driver license. Passing the knowledge skill tests does not guarantee that an applicant will be issued a driver's license. The DOL will determine if an applicant has met all the licensing requirements. If you are under the age of 18, you must be at least 16 years old, successfully completed a driver training course, have had your permit for at least 6 months and have had 50 hours of supervised driving experience with at least 10 of those hours at night to apply for your driver license.
 18. The DOL reserves the right to conduct random re-examinations; applicants refusing to take a re-exam may have their license revoked.
 19. Applicants who have received a DOL re-exam letter or have a temporary or permanent physical, visual, or mental condition that may impair their ability to drive must test at an DLO.
 20. Pursuant to RCW 46.20.720, a driver convicted of an alcohol offense may be required to have an Ignition Interlock Device (IID), to drive. The applicant must take the skill test in their vehicle using the IID.
 21. Applicants who need to use their own vehicle for their skills test are required to provide proof of insurance and current registration (current tabs) on the day of the test. An applicant's car must be legal to operate on public streets. This includes, but is not limited to, windshield, seat belts, wipers, defroster, tires, mirrors, all brake lights, and reverse lights, turn signals, and be legally licensed and have tabs current.
 22. We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone.
 23. Our grievance/complaint policies consist of talking to the manager or the owner of the school.
